The Department of Fish and Game (Department) is pleased to be working with the Reef Check California Program on your volunteer monitoring program. The Marine Life Protection Act (MLPA) specifically recognizes the role of monitoring projects to help design new MPA networks as well as assist with the adaptive management of existing MPAs. In addition, the MLPA Master Plan Framework notes the importance of volunteer monitoring programs to help supplement data needs and provide educational and outreach opportunities.

Reef Check's California Program provides the basis to establish a long-term standardized monitoring program in southern California consistent with Department protocols. 


