

On behalf of NOAA's National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS), I am writing to express support for the proposal submitted by the California Land Stewardship Institute (CLSI) for habitat restoration in the Suisun Creek watershed. Suisun Creek has been identified as a priority watershed in the San Francisco Bay area, and supports a run of steelhead trout listed as threatened under the Endangered Species Act (ESA). This grant would fund high priority projects identified in the Suisun Creek Watershed Enhancement Plan and will aid in the recovery of steelhead trout in the watershed. This plan was developed with community input through the Suisun Creek Restoration Team and utilized considerable scientific monitoring to determine limiting factors for steelhead and the highest priority projects for recovering the population. This grant would fund revegetation of stream corridors to improve shade canopy for rearing habitat in White Creek. This will help to lower stream temperature during crucial summer periods, will lead to increased recruitment of insects into the wood web, and provide detritus to aquatic invertebrate food webs crucial to juvenile rearing. Eradication of the invasive giant reed (*Arundo donax*) on Suisun Creek will be expanded from the four mile long project funded in 2005 to include several more miles. The eradication area will be replanted with native species providing the benefits noted above as well as providing habitat for birds and terrestrial animals. The grant will also facilitate removal of a strategic migratory barrier on Lower Wooden Valley Creek by funding project design and permitting. Removal of this barrier would provide access to 27.1 miles of blue line streams to all lifestages of steelhead trout. Allowing for the movement of juvenile steelhead to better habitat areas is expected to increase survival of the species and significantly aid in their recovery in the watershed.

CLSI is a non-profit organization dedicated to planning and implementing environmental stewardship, restoration and enhancement programs, and projects including educational activities, scientific studies, promotion of beneficial stewardship practices, and resource



conservation activities on private and public lands and waterways. NMFS has worked with CLSI for many years and is confident in their ability to successfully execute these projects.

Thank you for your consideration of this funding request and for your efforts in recovering listed salmonids in Suisun Creek and elsewhere through your programs.
