

I am writing in strong support of the funding of this trail improvement work. In an area where trails are becoming concrete sidewalks, this grant would improve and preserve both lateral and vertical, unpaved pathways.

The ideal route of the pedestrian corridor of the CCT in Rancho Palos Verdes is blocked in two places by single private properties. These two situations divert the corridor to the Palos Verdes Drive roadside for substantial distances. While we wait for the opportunity to open the access across these two properties on the bluff top, this proposed work will not be temporary. The roadside is the designated equestrian corridor.

All three "strings in the braid" are possible here in the Coastal Zone of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. Please choose to give us a "leg up" on the dream.
