

Exhibit 3: Project Images Gypsum: Canyon Road to County Line

SEGMENT 1: Proposed Trail Undercrossing (in addition to the existing service road)
Add a parallel (concrete) riding and hiking trail undercrossing of Gypsum Canyon Road;
also build a low debris wall to protect the trail.



Service road under Gypsum Canyon Road: Looking west (at river's edge).



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SEGMENT 2: Proposed trail on the north side of the Santa Ana River (Gypsum Canyon Road upstream one mile to Segment 3, a future trail and bikeway bridge). Construct trail at base of the levee service road. Improve the service road to also accommodate bicycles.



Looking east along the existing levee service road. Build the trail at the base of the levee service road. Improve the levee service road to also accommodate bicycles.



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SEGMENT 2: Looking east along the levee service road. Pave the service road with asphalt (to create the bikeway) and build the trail at its base.



Proposed bikeway and trail will leave the levee service road and turn south toward Segment 3, a future bikeway and trail bridge to span the Santa Ana River.



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SEGMENT 3: Future bikeway and trail bridge site. Looking south toward the Santa Ana River (the trees seen mid-picture). Bridge would begin near the location of the photograph.



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SEGMENT 4: Future Trail: Looking west along the Santa Ana River Class I Bikeway toward Canyon RV Park (County's Featherly Regional Park).



Future Trail: Looking east along the Santa Ana River Bikeway toward Riverside County. Build a length of trail from Gypsum Canyon Road (beginning at Canyon RV Park) to a future trail bridge over the river at the Green River Golf Club.



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SEGMENT 5: Future trail bridge site (mid-picture): Looking northeast across the Santa Ana River to the Green River Golf Course (OCFCD Property)



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SEGMENT 6: Future Trail: Looking northeast across the Santa Ana River and the Green River Golf Course to Chino Hills State Park. Build trail from Segment 5, a future bridge (lower right corner of the picture) along the west and north edge of the golf course.



Future Trail: Looking east along the north edge of the Green River Golf Course (OCFCD Property) adjacent to the Union Pacific Rail Right-of-Way.



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SEGMENT 6: Future Trail; Looking east along the north side of the Green River Golf Course (OCFCD Property)



Future Trail: Looking east along the north side of the Green River Golf Course to the County boundary line (top of rise) and end of Orange County project.
