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This map, created by Pacifica Land Trust volunteers, shows some of the informal trails that the public has worn over the years on land owned by the Conservancy and the City at the Pedro Point Headlands. The turn-off from Highway 1 labeled “Green Gate Entrance” does not have safe sightlines and is not suitable for public use. A new entrance to the west of the current one will be built by Caltrans once the Devil’s Slide tunnel is completed and the section of Highway One that runs along the bottom of the map is closed to cars and becomes part of the California Coastal Trail.
