COMPLETED TRAIL PROJECTS (2005-2014)

With the support of a \$1 million Conservancy grant awarded in 2005, State Parks completed three Coastal Trail projects using the California Conservation Corps trail crews within three coastal park units on the central and north coasts. A fourth project was initiated last summer, and with additional funds from the Sean Parker LLC it will be completed in 2015. As shown in the attached photos these projects have improved access to some of our coast's most scenic and wild parklands. All project scopes included planning, design, permitting and construction with substantial in-kind staff support from State Park district staff and cost-savings from using the Conservation Corps trail crews. The total cost for the pre-construction tasks for all four projects was approximately \$300,000.

Project #1: Julia Pfeiffer Burns State Park Ridge Trail (Monterey County)

Connects a system of trails from Highway One up to and along the Big Sur ridgeline.

Length of new trail: 3,000 feet

Cost: \$172,000



Project #2: Elephant Seal Vista Point Boardwalk (San Luis Obispo County)

A new fully ADA accessible boardwalk above the Piedras Blancas Elephant Seal Vista Point connects to two parking areas above the beach.

Length of new trail: 1,500 feet.

Cost: \$157,000



Project #3: Little River State Beach Trail (Humboldt County)

Two new parking lots, a new beach access stairway and a new / improved loop trail.

Length of new trail: One mile

Cost: \$166,000



Project #4: Garrapata State Park (Monterey County)

Phase 1- completed:

Length of new trail: 1,800 feet, including new stone foot bridge and overlook

Cost: \$175,000

Phase 2 - proposed:

Length of new trail: 1,100 feet, including two new stone overlooks

Cost: \$165,000 (including \$75,000 from the Parker LLC and \$70,000 from State Parks)
