Dear Mr. Bosco:

I am writing to express my strong support of the City of Brisbane's grant application to the California Coastal Conservancy to purchase a parcel of land to preserve additional open space and endangered species habitats on San Bruno Mountain.

The grant request will fund a portion of the purchase price in the acquisition of the land. The property, a 1.14 acre parcel, is in an area within the City of Brisbane known as the Brisbane Acres and is adjacent to San Bruno Mountain State and County Park. Since 1998, the City has acquired 50.2 acres within the Brisbane Acres using a combination of City funds, grants from the California Coastal Conservancy and US Fish and Wildlife Service and donations. The parcel of land being acquired is mainly oak woodland and is located on a spur ridge near the eastern end of San Bruno Mountain. This is an area known to be high quality habitat for the endangered Callippe Silverspot and Mission Blue butterflies.


Dear Mr. Bosco:




