California State Coastal Conservancy

Whereas, Karyn Gear has worked at the Coastal Conservancy for nearly 37 years;

Whereas, Karyn began her career at the Conservancy as an intern in October of 1987;

Whereas, Karyn served as the North Coast Regional Manager since 1998, the longest serving Regional Manager in Conservancy history;

Whereas, Karyn completed more than 60 land acquisitions and protected approximately 150,000 acres of land;

Whereas, Karyn contributed significantly to the protection of redwood forests in California;

Whereas, Karyn was the Conservancy's first tribal liaison and wrote the Conservancy's tribal consultation policy;

Whereas, Karyn completed the Conservancy's first tribal land return project with the Kashia;

Whereas, Karyn managed the construction of more than 18 miles of the Coastal Trail and played a role in many more miles of trail construction;

Whereas, Karyn managed the formation and growth of the Great Redwood Trail Agency;

Whereas, Karyn organized many Board tours of the North Coast, sometimes rainy, but always filled with amazing views of forests, rivers, wetlands, and ocean;

Whereas, Karyn seems to know everyone on the North Coast;

Whereas, Karyn has a sharp memory for details and a mind like a steel trap;

Whereas, Karyn was the Conservancy's toughest negotiator;

Whereas, Karyn was a mentor to many Conservancy staff and passed on her project management skills and historical knowledge to many staff and interns;

Whereas, Karyn's daughter Carly joined us on several board tours, and we got to watch her grow up and head off to college;

Whereas, Karyn's husband Cliff has been a friend to Conservancy staff;
