On April 5, 2024 the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department submitted a grant application to the Coastal Conservancy for the Upper Great Highway Climate Resilience Project.

On page 4 Section 4 Project Outcomes, bullet points 1 - 3 refer to public engagement activities.

A screenshot is attached.

However, on June 18, 2024 San Francisco Board of Supervisors legislation was introduced with the title [Initiative Ordinance - Park Code - Parkway at Upper Great Highway].

Its Board of Supervisors File # is 240706.

Its Department of Elections Submission of Measures identification number is E-140.

In the Initiative Ordinance is Section 6.13.

In Section 6.13. is subsection (C) Public Notice and Engagement.

The wording "and Engagement" was deleted with a strikethrough.

Conditions 2 - 4 in that subsection were also deleted with strikethroughs so there is no reference to community engagement.

A screenshot has been attached.

Therefore, the grant application is currently inconsistent with provisions of legislation file 240706.

I would strongly urge the Coastal Conservancy to continue this item so that San Francisco Recreation and Park Department can amend the grant application so that it's consistent with subsequent local legislation.
