
Coastal Conservancy


The Coastal Conservancy's jurisdiction covers about 30% of California's land area and approximately 75% of the population.

Agencies develop project solicitation & evaluation guidelines.

Prioritization criteria identified in the bond.

Grant Scoring & Evaluation

Priorities in Prop 1

- * advances purposes of Prop 1
- * leverage funding
- * produce the greatest public benefit
- * best available science informs decisions
- * use new or innovative technology or practices.
- * Greater than 100% matching funds
- * Benefits Disadvantaged Community

Projects reviewed by professionals in relevant fields.



Grant Application Tips

Pre-proposal consultation encouraged

Post-proposal consultation prohibited

Review the scoring criteria

Mapping: Lat-Longs and DACs

Matching Funds:

- SCC counts non-state match and in-kind match

- Include funds not yet awarded (explain status)

- Tell us if you are applying to state grant programs

Planning projects are eligible; but applicant must explain plan for how the project will be implemented
