**2. CITY OF PORT HUENEME EMERGENCY SHORLINE STABILIZATION**

Joan Cardellino of the State Coastal Conservancy presented the Staff Recommendation.

Speaking in favor of the Staff Recommendation: Jon Sharkey, City of Port Hueneme, Ellis Green, Mayor, City of Hueneme, Greg Brown, Community Development Director, City of Port Hueneme.

(Condition 4 was added to the proposed resolution, as indicated below.)

Resolution:

“The State Coastal Conservancy hereby authorizes disbursement of up to two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to the City of Port Hueneme (City) for the purpose of placing an emergency shoreline stabilization structure on approximately 2,200 linear feet of Hueneme Beach from the intersection of Market Street and Surfside Drive to the foot of the Port Hueneme Fishing Pier, subject to the following conditions:

1. Prior to the disbursement of funds, the City shall provide for the review and approval of the Executive Officer of the Conservancy evidence that the California Coastal Commission has approved a permit for the work.
2. Prior to the disbursement of funds, the City shall provide for the review and approval of the Executive Officer of the Conservancy a work program, schedule and budget for the project.
3. The City shall post a sign acknowledging ‘Proposition 12’ funding for this project in accordance with the guidelines of the Secretary for the Natural Resources Agency.

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4. The City shall take immediate and proactive action to seek repayment of the \$2 million to the State of California. The City shall coordinate closely with the Executive Officer and the Department of finance and the Legislature as needed.”

Findings:

“Based on the accompanying staff report and attached exhibits, the State Coastal Conservancy hereby finds that:

1. The proposed authorization is consistent with Chapter 9 of Division 21 of the Public Resources Code, regarding public access.
2. The proposed project will protect a public accessway that serves more than local public needs.
3. The proposed authorization is consistent with Senate Bill No. 436 (Jackson) and Assembly Bill No. 606 (Williams) approved by the Governor on September 28, 2013.”

Ms. Notthoff moved and Mr. Sadowski seconded. Agenda Item 2 was approved by a vote of 7-0 on a roll call vote: Ms. Notthoff – Yes, Ms. Moret – Yes, Mr. Sadowski – yes, Mr. Cash – Yes, Ms. Finn – yes, Ms. Hansch – Yes, Chair Bosco –Yes.
