

# **Grant Application Tips**

**Pre-proposal consultation encouraged** Post-proposal consultation prohibited Review the scoring criteria Mapping: Lat-Longs and DACs Matching Funds: SCC counts non-state match and in-kind match Include funds not yet awarded (explain status) Tell us if you are applying to state grant programs

Planning projects are eligible; but applicant must explain plan for how the project will be implemented

#### **Pre-Proposal Consultation**

Applicants are strongly encouraged to consult with Conservancy staff during the project solicitation period before submitting your application.

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

1. Is there a maximum or minimum grant award? No

- Will the Conservancy funding planning or only implementation? Yes Applicants do need to present a coherent strategy for how you plan to fund implementation. Prop 1 funds will not be granted for planning that does not directly support project implementation (i.e. regional plans).
- 3. Can applicants apply for multi-phase projects? **Yes** Applications should be for a specific project. Describe the entire project in your application.
- 4. Is there a geographic division of the Conservancy grant funds?
  No The Conservancy's Prop 1 funds are not allocated to specific geographies.

### Frequently Asked Questions, part 2

- 5. Are you going to award all the grants in the first round and run out of funding? (Should we apply now even if our project isn't ready)?
- 6. Is land acquisition eligible? Yes
- 7. Is the Conservancy coordinating with California Department of Fish and Wildlife and other agencies administering related grants? Yes
- The Conservancy typically funds a variety projects including public access, will these projects be eligible for Prop 1 funding? Maybe Projects must achieve at least one of the purposes of Prop 1, Chapter 6. However, projects that achieve multiple benefits are given extra points in the scoring.
